POINT LONSDALE LIGHTHOUSE was built in 1902 replacing an old wooden tower.

Admiralty number: K2194

Its elevation is 37 meters whilst the height of the concrete tower is 21 meters.

The range is about 20 kilometers.

The octagonal signal station and observation room were added in 1950.

The lighthouse is still manned today, it is also located close to another two lighthouses, called the BLACK light and the WHITE light.

The lighthouse was restored in 1997 and in 2002. It provides a very easy walk- about. There is public access to the area around the tower.
